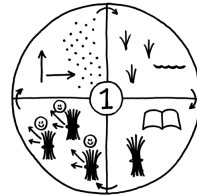

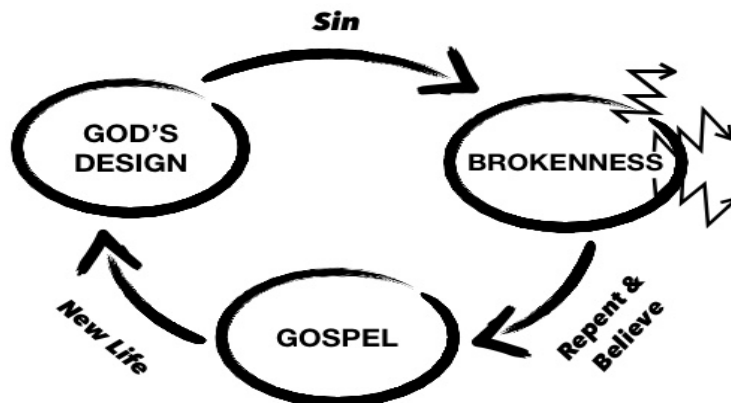

- Problem – Sin & Brokenness.** Sin separates us from God and from our original Purpose and Design. It brings brokenness. (Beware of cultural definitions of sin)
- Solution – Jesus (Gospel).** Jesus, a sinless man, is a perfect sacrifice for our sins through his death and resurrection. He gives new life, eternal life. He brings us into right relationship to God because he came from God.
- Response – Believe/Repentance.** (John 11:25-26). Believing with trust in Jesus' death for your sin. Repentance from sin: "I have been wrong before God. I need new life" (This is not about belonging to a religion, but faith in Christ alone).
- Result – Forgiveness from God.** An assurance you are forgiven.
New life now: "Christ in you" (Col. 1:27). Eternal life. The gift of Holy Spirit.

The Three Circles



- Share with Anyone. Do Not Choose Who.** 

Ask Questions such as:

- Which one of these circles do you identify with?
Which one would you like to be in?
- How will you know when your sins will be paid for?
I am not talking about religion, but faith.
- Do you believe Jesus came to forgive your sin and restore you to his perfect design?

Practice sharing with another person using the Three Circles.

Gospel Resources

You already have the best "tools" to share the gospel - your passion, your mouth, your actions. There are many different ways though to present and unpack the Good News. The three Circles is just one way. You need to use ways in your location that are relevant to the culture and worldview of your focus people.
