For One Field One Goal

Lead People to Believe and Baptise Them John 4:39-42

Jesus' example:

Believe: John 16:30-31, 11:25-26. Baptise: John 3:22-23.

Apostles' Example from Acts:

2:38-41

8:12-13

16:30-33

18:8

(see also: John 4:1-4; Acts 9:17-18; 10:42-48; 13:12; 13:38-39; 15:7-9; 16:14-15; 19:4-5; 22:16; 26:27-28)

Lead People to Believe

This is often a process - over time, not a single event.

a) Share the good news about Jesus and ask questions like:

- "Do you believe this?" OR
- "Are you willing to follow Jesus?" OR
- "Can I pray with you for any issue, sickness or situation for you?"

A simple prayer:

"Lord God, I believe Jesus died on the cross for my sins as a perfect sacrifice and was raised. I need forgiveness of my sins and eternal life. I turn from sin and open my life for you to be my Saviour and Lord".

b) If they believe, mention baptism. Do not wait weeks or months. Ask:

"When can you be baptised?"

Do NOT ask *"Do you want to be baptised?"* Most people will say no, and then you have a problem to convince them about baptism. Use the when question.

Baptise Them

Baptism is a command. It is also symbol of identifying with what Jesus has done for us.

What to do when Baptising.

- a) Read some stories from book of Acts. Acts 2:38-41. 16:30-33, 19:18-20 (confess)
- b) Allow them to ask questions. Keep it simple.
- c) When baptising say something like this:

"Have you <u>turned from sin in your heart and actions and <u>do you believe</u> that Jesus died and rose again as the <u>only perfect sacrifice</u> for your sins?" ...</u>

"I baptise you in the name of the Father, the Son and Holy Spirit, and I baptise you in the name of Jesus".


In Acts the apostles also baptised in the name of Jesus. 2:38, 8:16.

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Transition 1

Transition from **seed sowing** to leading people **to believe and baptise them**.

Get over the line. John 11:26



Who Can Baptise and Where?

John 3:22-23, 4:1-2. Jesus himself was not baptising, his disciples were.

1 Cor. 1:14-16. Paul says that he did not Baptise anyone except a few people.

See Acts 18:8. So who did the baptising if Paul did not?

- a) Baptism <u>does NOT require an audience</u>. Not a special person to baptise. Not a special place. Read the book of Acts. Think movement dynamics. Train new believers to baptise others.
- b) Many people think that only special people can baptise and that baptism needs a lot of preparation. A fear of some people is that a new believer will not understand baptism, unless you train them for a long time in classes.

Remember, preparing for baptism is not about giving a theology class. Rather, seeing in scripture the importance and meaning of baptism and how it is a simple act of identifying with what Christ has done.

- c) Baptism does not have to mean a change of culture or community.
- d) Baptism does not mean a change of a person's name.

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
